

BARC MEETING 10-30-06

Present: Ted Davenport, Linda Flues, Mike Klosowski, Dan Dobberstein, Mitch Miller, Greg Rankin, Tom Rushford, David Cable, Peg and Elliott Deyo, and Leonard Block

The meeting opened up at 7:00 pm.

Fees were discussed for others that may want to use the overhead clock and time machine. It was decided that the fee would be \$40 each or \$70 for both per use. The fees will be paid up front and a form must be signed so if the items are damaged, they will pay to get the items fixed.

Some recent courses have been mis-measured and ideas were brought up on how to prevent this in the future. It was discussed that the chalk that is used on ball diamonds could be useful and Ted said he would look more into it and talk to local schools on price and availability on the product.

Linda mentioned that at the next meeting the 2007 race schedule should be ready. The race schedule needs to be in place to get BARC and most BARC assisted races under the insurance.

Ted mentioned there weren't any updates on the Race for Life. Ted didn't think Ann Gasta and Terry Schwartz met yet about the details on the future of the race.

Next year Bill Agresta is going to have a race and it will be posted on the schedule on the BARC website when the 2007 schedule is available.

Linda mentioned that the winter BARC races will be re-measured with the wheel. Three different courses will be ready so if weather or other conflicts occur, a substitute course will be available. Linda also mentioned the BARC meeting minutes will have a link to them on the BARC website. Mitch said he will work on that.

Mitch mentioned the website domain name has been renewed for another year. Everything is up to date and more links may possibly be added for running websites that may be of interest to runners.

No new updates on the 2007 St. Pats race. It still hasn't been decided on who will do the entry form as a few changes may be made.

The shirts that were purchased for Rustic Rhodes were overpriced when paid for and Linda mentioned that Gary Scott talked to the shirt supplier and the price was reduced \$181.26. This was a mistake by the supplier but the problem is now resolved.

A detailed breakdown of what the differences are between a BARC, BARC assisted, and non BARC races are. An example of a BARC race is the Winter Series. An example of a BARC assisted race is St. Stans. An example of a non BARC race is Scary Runners.

Mitch will on the website color the fonts on the schedule to differentiate the differences like have black font for BARC races and red font for BARC assisted and non BARC races. A motion was carried to send a letter out to race directors for BARC assisted races to let them know of a new \$25 fee to cover insurance costs that BARC provides.

It was announced the 2007 St. Pats race will have the same race course.

The next BARC meeting will be on Monday, November 27th at 7:00 pm at the Y.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 pm.
